Contact tracing from Monday 19th July

Please see the letter sent with this letter, this details what you will need to do if your child has covid symptoms or tests positive from Monday. It is no longer the case that whole bubbles in school will have to isolate. Instead track and trace will contact you and support you to identify close contacts. Then only your household and those few close contacts will have to isolate for the 10 day period. Aspire schools will no longer be involved in the process. Please let the school know if your child or anyone in your household tests positive- thank you.

Free Bus Travel for Year 6


As part of the reconnect programme children in year 6 will be bringing home a cardboard ticket. This entitles them to free bus travel on Stagecoach and Arriva buses between Thursday 22nd July and Tuesday 31st August 2021.

In addition to this a number of Kent leisure centres are offering children a six week pass for £25 or £10 if they receive free school meals (benefit related) so it is worth contacting your local leisure centre if you are interested.

If you have a child in year 6 and they don't bring home the ticket please contact the school office.(Leeds and Broomfield parents, please note that we have not yet received tickets but will send them out as soon as we get them.)
