Waiting times for pediatrics

We understand that if you are waiting for a paediatrics assessment for your child, it is very frustrating as the waiting times are so long. At school we have no influence or control over this, but we can share the information we have. Please find below the latest communication we have received.

Waiting times for our Community Paediatrics Services

We wanted to write to you about the waiting times for our Community Paediatric Service, in particular, the autism spectrum disorder assessment and the work we are doing to see children faster.

You may have seen the coverage from the Ofsted and Care Quality Commission inspection into care provided to children with special education needs (SEND) across the county and we know we all – Kent County Council, NHS Kent and Medway, schools and settings – want to do better for the children and families.

Like the rest of the country, waiting times for some of our services have increased due to the Covid-19 pandemic, increasing referral rates and a shortage of speech and language therapists. In particular, the wait for an autism spectrum disorder assessment is now between **36 to 42 months** for those children who need a joint assessment.

We would like to apologise and the reasons for the long waits are no consolation for the children, their families – or schools, like yourselves who are supporting them.

Our waiting lists were recently reviewed and we wanted to be honest and share this with families and also with your school, so everyone knows what to expect and importantly, how we can work better together to help these children and families.
