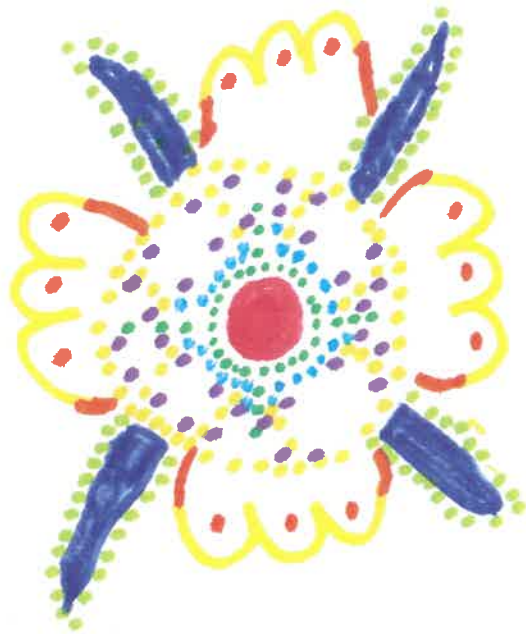
In Badgers, a different group focused on different aspects of various faiths and non-faith.

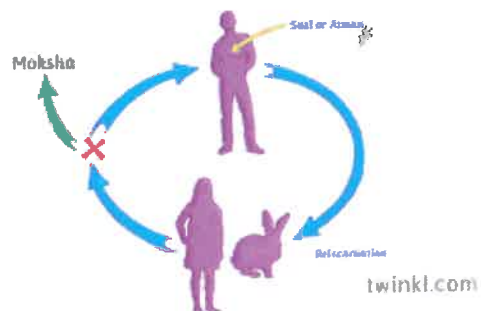
Key Question: What does it mean to be Hindu in Britain today?

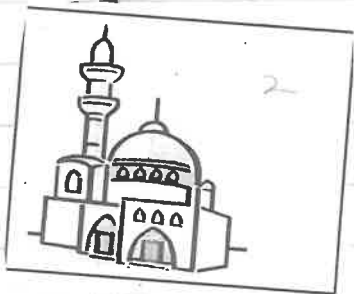

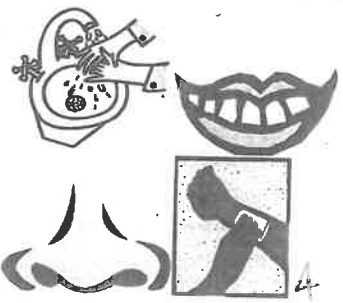
Muslims are called to the Mosque to pray. The most important day to go is on Friday when special prayers are said.



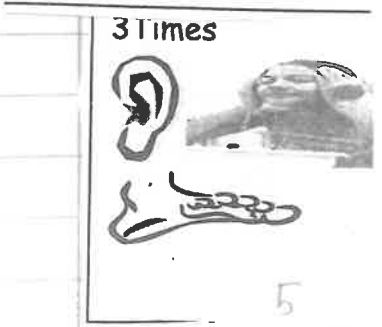
Then they go to pray inside the Mosque.
