



Hindu Dharma believe in reincarnation - what they do in one life affects their next life when they are reborn. What duties (dharma) might they need to have to have good karma?






Muslims are called to the Mosque to pray. The most important day to go is on Friday when special prayers are said.




Then they go to pray inside the Mosque.
