## Opportunity for Adult Education Course supporting children with ADHD-

A course is being provided by Adult Education at Leeds and Broomfield. This course will run for 4 consecutive weeks starting on **30th April running until 21st MAy.** This will be from 1pm finishing at 3pm.

This course is supporting children with ADHD in the home, the course is for parents of children who either have an ADHD diagnosis, are undergoing the referral process or there is a possibility your child has ADHD.

The minimum number of adults for the course to run is 8 adults and the maximum number is 15. The places will be allocated on a first come first served basis.
