

Is there enough to go around?

Term 5 Home Learning.

The theme for our learning this term is our planet and how we are taking care of our environment.

We will be focusing on our geography skills this term alongside english and maths. We will be finding out about renewable energies and the responsibility that we have for the protection of our planet and how we can achieve this.

To support your learning in school, here are some activities for you to complete at home.

Remember, you do not have to complete all of the activities, one per week will be fine. Please can all books be back in school the final week of term.

Home Learning activities.

- Our class book for this term is "*The Last Wild*" by Piers Torbay. Write a biography about his life so far and his inspiration behind this book as well as the sequels that he has also written.
- We have talked about the words 'utopian' and 'dystopian'. Can you remember what they mean? Imagine you live in one of these worlds. What is it like? How do you feel living there? How have you come to live in a world like this? You can create this piece of work as a written piece, or if you prefer, as a work of art or comic book/storyboard.
- What do you think our future is going to look like? Create a poster/information booklet about life in the future. Where will we be living? What will we be eating? Is travel still something that we can do?
- Build/design a model to explain how renewable energy works. You could focus on a wind turbine, solar power or any other form of renewable energy.
- We all have a role to play in securing the future of our planet, however small, so, as a school, what can we do? How do we future proof our school? Research and create an action plan that we may be able to follow at school. This could include creating areas that attract wildlife as well as thinking about how we use the resources that we have in school.
- Create a map of your local area, thinking about the symbols that you could use to highlight important resources. You may want to show where all of the bins are so that people can be encouraged to use them rather than litter. Are there any local recycling points for people to use eg clothing banks? These can all be marked on your map as symbols you create for them. (You will need to include a key) Don't forget to grid your map in a similar way to the OS maps we have been looking at.
