All four ASPIRE Schools are friends of the Honey Bee. We would like to highlight that World Bee day is on Monday 20th May.

Here are some interesting facts about Bees:

Did you know that bees have been the most vital pollinator on the planet for centuries? They're truly fascinating creatures! And if you think you know everything about them, wait until you hear these surprising facts...

1. Bees are responsible for pollinating 70% of the world's crops, which means that without them, our food supply would be in serious trouble.



- 2. Honeybees are not native to North America. They were brought over by European settlers in the 1600s.
- 3. Bees can recognize human faces and have a unique way of communicating with one another through dance.
- 4. A hive of bees can fly up to 55,000 miles to collect enough nectar to make one pound of honey.
- 5. Bees are capable of flying at speeds up to 15 miles per hour, and their wings beat around 200 times per second.

To help celebrate World Bee day children at Platts Heath will be invited to wear yellow on black on Monday 20th May to raise awareness.
