NEFLT Parent Support-

Information about Online Support Intervention (OSI):

OSI (Online Support and Intervention) is an online platform designed to help parents to learn tools and techniques to help their child (aged 5 to 12 years old) to overcome difficulties with anxiety.

Parents work through weekly online modules that contain videos, quizzes, and interactive worksheets. Parents are also supported by a weekly telephone/video call appointment with a practitioner. You can access OSI at a convenient time for you using any electronic device!

This support may be suitable for those children who are experiencing problems with anxiety, such as:

- Difficulties being away from caregivers
- General worries
- School worries
- Bedtime fears
- Social worries
- Phobias (e.g. spiders, dogs, injections)
- And more

Within the newsletter is a link to a parent online session due to take place Wednesday 22nd January 2025 at 4.00pm. The subject for the first session is “Sextortion” which is a form of online intimate image abuse. It involves the threat of sharing images or videos – often ‘nudes’ or sexually explicit content – to extort money or force someone to do something against their will. Sadly, it is a growing crime and involves offenders creating fake online profiles and then targeting young people.

Also, within the document, are helpful guides for parents around online safety and social media which will be useful when setting up new Christmas presents. There is also an Escoter flyer that covers the legalities with use as these are often popular presents that cost lots of money and can be seized by police.

I have also attached leaflets around Whatsapp and Snapchat parental controls/online safety support, which provides helpful information.

Bounce

We are thrilled to announce that from January 2025, Aspire Federation will be providing a new provision for children called Bounce.

Bounce is a provision designed specifically by Miss Liddicoat, for selected children to cover a range of alternative activities and learning opportunities to focus on the characteristics of effective learning. The children invited to attend, have been carefully considered by each school and the Senior Senco, Mrs Coleman.



The provision will see children undertake opportunities such as rock climbing, boxing and visits to Leeds Castle.

Platts Heath begin their Bounce journey in term 3. The provision will run for a 6 week block, every afternoon from 1-3pm. Parents of Platts Heath have already been contacted by Miss Liddicoat if their child has been offered a place.

Term 4 - Leeds and Broomfield

Term 5 - Ulcombe

Term 6 - Kingswood

We are really excited to start this unique and bespoke provision and look forward to sharing further updates with regards to Bounce in coming months.
