What is Child Protection about?

All of the adults around you think that your health, safety and welfare are very important.

In our school, we respect our children and help to protect their rights.

We do our best to help children make good educational progress.

We teach children how to recognise risks in different situations, and how to protect themselves and stay safe.

How will we try to protect children?

We try to provide a safe environment for children to learn in;

We want to help to ensure that children remain safe, at home as well as at school; We think it is important for our children to know where to get help if they are worried or unhappy about something.

Don't keep it a secret if:

Someone is bullying you;

If someone is trying to persuade you to believe or do things that you think are not right;

Saying funny things to you that you do not like or upsets you;

Touching you in places you know are wrong;

Trying to give you tablets, cigarettes, drugs or alcohol;

Hitting you or hurting you;

Sending unkind messages on the internet or to your phone;

Taking pictures or videos of you that make you feel uncomfortable;

Not making sure that your home is safe, warm and that there is food in the kitchen/cupboards.
