Foxes— have started learning about the Ancient Greeks and have been looking at Greek Myths—Theseus and the minotaur—and have been designing decorations for Greek pottery.


Squirrels - have started learning about the Mayan civilisations and looking at the new class book “Rain Player” and have been making predictions about the book based on the front cover.
